The requirements for the Doctor of Philosophy degree in School Psychology at MU meet the standards for school psychologist certification in Missouri, and are consistent with requirements for credentialing as a Nationally Certified School Psychologist. A. Prerequisites to Graduate Study in the Department:

Each student is required to complete 15 semester hours of prerequisite coursework in order to ensure successful pursuit of graduate level study. This prerequisite coursework should include 3 credits each in statistics and measurement, as well as 9 credits total in basic psychology, including introductory psychology as well as coursework in the areas of personality, developmental, cognitive, educational, social, abnormal/clinical, and/or biological psychology. The 15 hours can be met by undergraduate or graduate course work and can be taken before or concurrently with the master's program. These hours do not count toward hours required for the doctoral degree.
